




Background: CAC's

- CACs recognize members of the CFPC who
 - Have achieved a level of competence in the domain of practice of the CAC that is above the standard competencies in family medicine
 - Will demonstrate maintenance in the area of the CAC through MainPro+ over their five year cycle
- CAC in ESS approved by Board May 2015
- Subdivided into ESS and OSS in 2018

1. Working Group on the Assessment of Competence in ESS

- Tasked with developing Priority Topics and their Key Features-Competencies that can be assessed and should be assessed
- Different then setting up a curriculum
- Work to be completed April 8th, 2019
- Composition: Novel
 - 4 family physicians with ESS (including a program director)
 - 2 Royal College trained general surgeons (CAGS representative and Chair of RC Committee on General Surgery)
 - 2 Royal College trained OB surgeons (President of SOGC and representative of RC Committee on OB)
 - SRPC representative

2. CAC Peer Review Committee

- Developing eligibility criteria for leaders and initial applicants Main task: to review applications and recommend to BOE for awarding of CACs
- To start with those leaders/practitioners already in practice
- Presently practicing in broad spectrum of ESS/OSS
- Composition:
 - Three family physicians in the domain of care
 - One family physician from a different CAC-approved domain of care
 - One broad-base family physician without a CAC
- Application to open in next few months

3. Training Programs

- Category 1 status
 - Defined by national standards to which programs must adhere
 - In addition to standard accreditation expectations
 - Assessment by accreditation committee for initial transfer to Category 1 status
